Stream Corridor Invasive Control Project

The City of Lebanon is undergoing a non-native invasive plant control project in our parks to make our stream corridor more visible and accessible. This is a large-scale, multi-year non-native invasive plant removal and treatment project.

- Harmon Park, including the Disc Golf Course, Runyan Field and the Sarah Polly Park



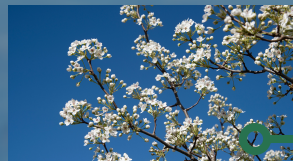
Types of Non-Native Invasives:

Multiflora Rose



Tree-Of-Heaven

What To Expect:

Some trails and park features may be temporarily closed for public safety when work is being done in the area.

Workers will cut down the invasive plants, chip and spread them back on the site. The only exception is tree-of-heaven, which will be treated and left standing until dead. Herbicide will be applied by a licensed pesticide applicator.

All native trees and shrubs will be left standing.
