



## What do I do with...?

**Paint** Just open the lid and let the paint dry. Once it's non-fluid, simply place it in your household trash with the lid off. Because oil paint takes longer to dry, you may want to paint it on an old cardboard box, then throw away the box. Another option is to absorb the paint with kitty litter. Once absorbed, toss it in the trash. Also, there are products available at hardware stores that dry out paint for disposal.



### Motor Oil, Antifreeze, Car Fluids

Take used motor oil, antifreeze, transmission fluid and brake fluid to an automobile service center or parts store for disposal. Be sure to call the store or service center first. Not all stores will accept fluids.

**Car Batteries** Lead acid batteries such as those used in vehicles, motorcycles, wheelchairs and boats may not go in the trash. By Ohio law, wholesalers and retailers of lead acid batteries must take your old battery for recycling when you buy a new one. So, when you purchase a new battery, be sure to bring the old one with you.

### Pesticides & Fertilizer

The best thing to keep in mind about pesticides and fertilizers is don't buy too much. Just buy enough for one season and use it up. If you need to dispose of some pesticides or fertilizers you can take them to the following location for a small fee:
