ROADWAY IMPROVEMENT INVESTMENT

For years 2018-2022, spending on roadway improvement projects increased by **80%** compared to prior years and this number will continue to increase. The City of Lebanon continues to leverage State and Federal grants to improve key roadways including Main Street, Broadway, and Columbus Avenue.

PARKS SYSTEM

700 acres of public park and greenspace for all to enjoy, including over 12 miles of trails.

Completed the construction of the **Savage Welcome Center** and celebrated the 10 year anniversary of Miller Ecological Park.

Completed the replacement of the Pleasant Park playground.

UTILITIES

Completed the construction of the new \$12 million Glosser Road Sanitary Sewer Pump Station to

ensure pumping capacity meets current and future demands.

Residential electric rates are **30% lower** than the surrounding communities.

Replaced **3 miles of aging, deteriorated water, sanitary and storm sewer pipe** over
the past five years.

FINANCIAL HEALTH

\$33.1 million in grants secured over the past five years to support various projects & programs to serve the City.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

\$111.4 million in private and public investment through business and residential development over the past two years.

\$158,000 in business-related grants awarded to support over \$4.2 million in capital investment by 18 different small businesses, enhancing economic vitality.

Annexed over 80 acres into the City in the business park to support business growth.

Redevelopment of N Broadway corridor to include **new residential**, **businesses** and pickleball courts.

PUBLIC SAFETY

Police o-

Achieved accreditation through CALEA for the **37th year**in a row. The Lebanon Division of Police is
one of only **57 law enforcement agencies in**Ohio to achieve this national accreditation, and it speaks to
the professionalism of the department.

Added a second School Resource Officer. The School Resource Officers handled nearly **200 calls** for service during the 2022-2023 school year. The SRO program is a critical component to safety in Lebanon City Schools.

The Lebanon Communications Center received approximately **33,000 calls for service** and generated over 20,000 calls for service last year.

Promoted a **new Fire Chief** in June.

Department has experienced a **25% increase** in Fire & EMS calls for service over the past five years.

Enhanced focus on community outreach programs, such as **CPR classes.**
